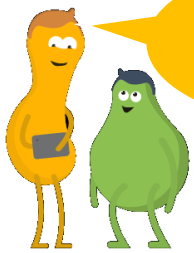


Know Your Role Play Your Part



Reporting ADEs/ADRs helps improving safety

Monitor patient's response e.g. labs (INR, serum levels, Cr) and symptoms (Fever, Pain etc.)

Report adverse drug events and reactions (ADEs, ADRs) to pharmacy department and to PV Centers via MedSafety app (download from Play Store)

Identify patient correctly

Match the medicine against actual order

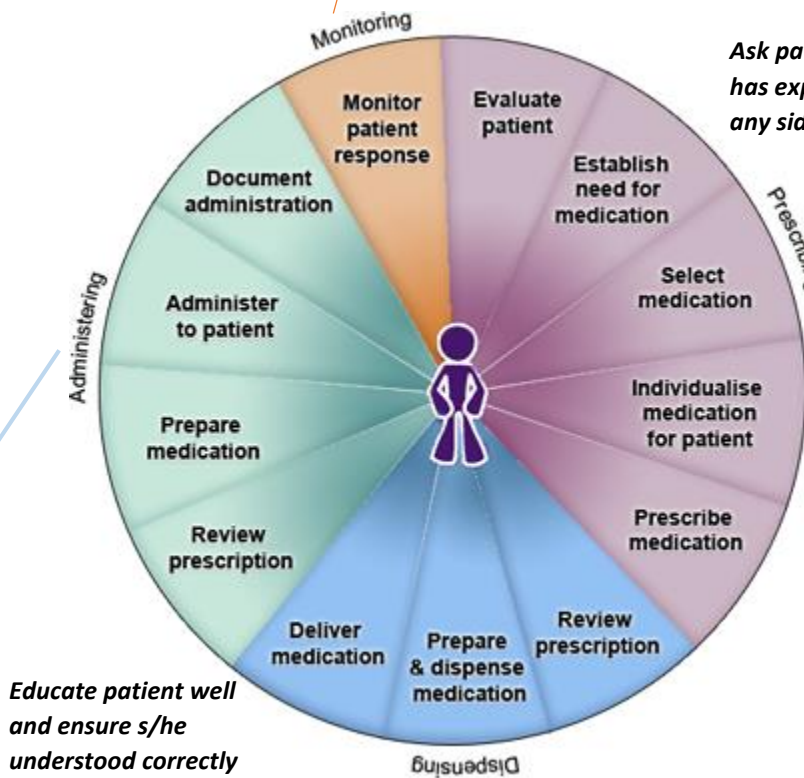
Prepare in a clean, safe and clutter free environment

Label the medicines if not immediately administered

Injectable are carefully diluted in compatible solutions

Administer properly

Monitor patient
Document in medication administration record



Educate patient well and ensure s/he understood correctly

Ask patient if s/he has experienced any side effects

Identify patient correctly
Weight based dosing e.g. for pediatric patients
Adjusted doses based on renal, liver functions, serum drug levels and/or comorbid etc.
Avoid duplications
Follow prescribing guidelines
Check contraindications, allergies and interactions



Know your High Alert Medicines

Review prescription against weight, need for adjusted doses, check duplications, contraindications, allergies and interactions.

Match against prescribing guidelines
Prepare in a clean, safe and clutter free environment

Recheck after preparation/filling and before dispensing
Dispense in a way that its safety and efficacy is ensured

Report if you feel unwell after taking a medicine



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
